The United States Congress created the Veterans History Project in 2000 as part of the American Folklife Center at the Library of Congress in Washington D.C.

The mission of the Veterans History Project is to collect and archive the personal recollections of U.S. wartime veterans to honor their service and share their stories with current and future generations. The Project also collects stories from home front civilians who worked in support of our armed forces.

HELP PRESERVE HISTORY

Donated collections take the form of war veterans' first-hand oral histories, memoirs, photographs, letters, diaries, official separation documents (DD-214, etc.) and other historical documents from World War I, World War II and the Korean, Vietnam and Persian Gulf wars.



On behalf of a deceased war veteran, you may submit historical documents like the veteran's collection of photographs, letters, diaries or memoirs. You will need to complete a biographical data form and a release form for the deceased veteran.
